## THE UP FRONT NEWS

In an effort to keep the front entrance looking as good as possible, you are invited to be a part of The Rockin' Weed Wranglers on the Ridge. The Weed Wranglers will pull weeds, pick up litter and other general tidying of the front entrance by both of the brick monuments. Rebecca Saguin has agreed to chair this effort. She and her husband, JP, did this throughout last year, but there is plenty of opportunity for extra help.

As you know from your own yards, if we get some rain and then some high temps, any weeds that are up there, grow like, well, *weeds* – overnight it seems. So, if some volunteers could take turns attending to it on a weekly basis, it should look all the better throughout the summer.

The City of Centennial does spray for weeds. However, no spray is 100% effective, so some weeds will always break through. Once growing, the city does not remove them. Nor, does it corral the trash that blows in from East Dry Creek Road. That is why regular tidying is needed.

After the spring snows are over, the plan is to look at the state of the landscaping rocks on the ground to see if there needs to be some replacement of those. In addition, now that the overgrowth was cleared last year, it is apparent that the stone monuments are in need of some repair and that should occur as well.

Together with the work of the Weed Wranglers, the tree maintenance that was done last year to maintain the safety of the entrance and the expected repairs this year, the Falcon Ridge front entrance should be a great reflection of the pride we all have in our neighborhood.

## TIME TO REFINANCE OR SELL?

When property or a mortgage loan is changing hands, in addition to information from the homeowner, title companies request information from the HOA.
